MAKE YOUR OWN AT THE IAC

Ceramic tile—Wednesday June 9, 10-12am. Cost is \$40, plus \$15 to mail the ceramic tile.

Glass paperweight—Wednesday June 9, 1-3pm. Cost is \$40. You may pick up your piece of glass before the convention is over.

Indianapolis Museum of Art has a small (about 60 pieces) of studio glass, some of which is Czech. www.imamuseum.org
